**UNITED STATES SENATE RACE- OPEN SEAT (99% reporting)**

Alexi Giannoulias (D)	1,694,093 (46.3%)

- All 19 Congressional seats were up in 2010
- Pre-election split: 12 Democrats / 7 Republicans  
Post-election split: 8 Democrats /11 Republicans
- 14 incumbent members of Congress WON their races (8 Ds and 6 Rs). **4 Democrat** incumbents LOST their races. Melissa Bean (D-8<sup>th</sup>), Debbie Halvorson (D-11<sup>th</sup>), Bill Foster (D-14<sup>th</sup>) and Phil Hare (D-17<sup>th</sup>). There was **1 Open Seat in the 10<sup>th</sup> District- RPAC supported Robert Dold (R) WON.**

The NAR RPAC Trustees conducted **4** Opportunity Races in the Illinois Congressional delegation—Incumbents Melissa Bean (D-8<sup>th</sup>), Debbie Halvorson (D-11<sup>th</sup>), Bill Foster (D-14<sup>th</sup>), and challenger Robert Dold in the OPEN 10<sup>th</sup>. The incumbents all LOST and the challenger WON.

**In the Illinois House of Representatives:**

- All 118 seats were up in the 2010 general election.
- There were **46** SAFE districts where the seat was UNCONTESTED. This represents **39%** of the races.
- Pre-election split: 70 Democrats / 48 Republicans  
Post-election split: 64 Democrats / 54 Republicans
- There were **13 OPEN SEATS** this year.
  - District 9 - D seat- Uncontested- Art Turner (D) won
  - District 11- D seat- Ann Williams v Scott Tucker- Williams (D) won
  - District 17- R seat-Daniel Biss v Hamilton Chang- Biss (D) won **FLIP/GAIN FOR Ds**
  - District 29- D seat- Thaddeus Jones v Kenny Williams- Jones (D) won
  - District 35- D seat- Bill Cunningham v B.R. Bellar- Cunningham (D) won
  - District 36- D seat- Kelly Burke v R. Grabowski- Burke (D) won
  - District 41- R seat- B. Stephenson v Chris Nybo- Nybo (R) won
  - District 54- R seat- Matt Flamm v Tom Morrison- Morrison (R) won
  - District 56- D seat- Michelle Mussman v Ryan Higgins- Mussman (D) won

- **5** incumbent House members lost in the general election:

  - Democrat Careen Gordon lost to Republican Sue Rezin—75<sup>th</sup> District
  - Democrat Michael Smith lost to Republican Michael Unes—91<sup>st</sup> District
  - Democrat Bob Flider lost to Republican Adam Brown—101<sup>st</sup> District
  - Democrat Jay Hoffman lost to Republican Dwight Kay—112<sup>th</sup> District
- The IAR RPAC Trustees conducted **11** Opportunity Races (extra grassroots efforts) in the Illinois House of Representatives- **9 of the 11 WON (82% SUCCESS RATE).**

**In the Illinois State Senate:**

- 21 of the 59 seats were up in the 2010 general election.
- There were **6** SAFE districts where the seat was UNCONTESTED. This represents **29%** of the races.
- Pre-election split: 37 Democrats/ 22 Republicans  
Post-election split 35 Democrats/ 24 Republicans
- A Democrat was appointed late in the summer to replace Senator Jim DeLeo (D) however, the seat was considered to be an **OPEN SEAT**.  
District 10- D seat- John Mulroe v Brian Doherty- Mulroe (D) won
- **TWO** incumbent State Senators were defeated
  - Democrat Michael Bond lost to Republican Suzi Schmidt—31<sup>st</sup> District
  - Democrat Deanna Demuzio lost to Republican Sam McCann—49<sup>th</sup> District
- The IAR RPAC Trustees conducted **7** Opportunity Races (extra grassroots efforts) in the Illinois State Senate. **3 of the 7 WON (43% SUCCESS RATE)**.
